

Noblesville Parks and Recreation Board Minutes May 4, 2016

CALL TO ORDER: President Thurston called the meeting to order at 7:00pm.

APPROVAL OF AGENDA: President Thurston asked if there were any additions or deletions to the agenda. President Thurston asked for the approval of the Agenda. Ms. Minnich moved to approve the Agenda as presented and Mr. Noel seconded this motion. No further discussion was held and the motion passed unanimously.

REPORTS

Recreation Report

Ms. Nichole Haberlin reviewed her report with the Board which was in the packet. Ms. Haberlin said her division was still looking for camp counsels and they had lost two already for other positions.

Mr. Bennett added under Ms. Haberlin report that the department had started discussions for the lease update and renewal with Dr. Clark at Ivy Tech. It was a good and productive meeting with him with the possibility of expanding the lease and the department's relationship with Ivy Tech to include an auditorium and a banquet facility. Mr. Bennett said they had to have a lease back to the Park Board by June or July. Discussion was held. (Staff Report Attached)

• Director of Golf Report - Gary Deakyne

Mr. Deakyne distributed his report to the Board. Mr. Deakyne said April was not so good. He said that the days that were good the golf revenue was really good, but the days that were bad the golf revenue was really bad. Fox Prairie was down \$9,000.00, but still up for the year and Forest Park was down about \$3,000.00 and just a little down for the year. He said they had a lot of programs set up for juniors which his golf assistant is taking care of. Mr. Deakyne also said the Pro Shop is coming along. He said he just needs good weather and he will bring in the revenue. Mr. Deakyne said the golf course is in good shape and they had a big week at Fox; PGA Plane Ability test tomorrow, The Indiana Tournament of Champions Friday and Saturday.

Mr. Bennett said the staff is doing a good job on improvements on the bunkers.

• Assistant Director Report

Mr. Hoffmeister reported that the Park Foundation raised over \$12,000.00 at their luncheon last Friday. He also reported that the Step 'n Stride event had about 75 runners last Saturday; the Pitch In Run had about 70 boys-huge turn-out. Mr. Hoffmeister said he had groups asking for service hours and he will be meeting with them. He reported that the Relay for Life will be in two weekends and for this event the whole park is almost closed. Mr. Hoffmeister told the Board that tonight's meeting will be the last meeting that Mikayla Mirowski and Isaac Irvin will be attending. President Thurston thanked them for their contribution to the Park Board.

<u>Enrollment:</u> 158 participants in our programs this month with 20 classes offered. This is a decrease in participation from last month of nine participants, and a decrease of 136 participants from April, 2015. The difference from last year would be Spring Break being reflected in last month's report and not as a part of normal program totals. We are also still growing the Yoga program. On April 23, the annual Earth Day-Arbor Fest took place. We had great weather at Shelter 5 estimating 300 participants between 10am-1pm. The grand total of participation this month 458 participants.

<u>Staffing:</u> We have hired a Summer Intern who will be starting May 9th. We hope to be finishing up counselor interview in the next two weeks.

Park Terms and Definitions:

Summary:

Despite the rainy weather, the construction of Federal Hill Commons continues to progress. Many different aspects of the project are being installed in the next few weeks. The most noticeable will be the installation of the stone and brick on the restroom building. The stairs should be formed and poured in the next few weeks at the front of the amphitheater. Fill is being placed and compacted behind the story wall and amphitheater to bring it up to grade. Storm pipe and structures are being installed as are a few sewer structures. The roof to the Rotary Shelter has been installed as well.

Background:

Federal Hill Commons is the park the city determined met the best use for a 6.4 acre tract of land between 32 and Logan Street and Nixon and St. Rd. 19. The land, mostly floodplain, has been home to Dave Mason Car Repair and open space. The City will also acquire the existing Ameriana Bank in 2016 as a part of this project. Through the vision of the city as well as several focus groups, the program has been determined to include an amphitheater, event space, restrooms and storage, a farmer's market plaza, interactive water feature, shelters, trails, playground, and parking. It will also eventually be connected by a pedestrian bridge across the river from the Hamilton County Judicial Center. The project is slated to begin construction in summer and have the initial phase open 2016.

Park Terms and Definitions:

Summary:

This contract is the same contract we have had with NEFL over the past several years to lease the fields at the Dillon Park. Nothing from the original lease has changed, but we have added an addendum. That addendum allows the NEFL to utilize space at Ivy Tech, with their permission, to move their equipment storage and distribution to the old varsity football locker rooms as permanent storage. This frees up the space currently occupied by NEFL at Dillon Park in the basement of the Maintenance building. This will allow us to utilize that space for our growing operation and storage. We will also utilize the space as rainy weather shelter and a storm shelter. We will convert that space to keep the maintenance and storm area separate.

Background:

Dillon Park is the home to the Football program in Noblesville. NEFL is a great partner to utilize the fields during the summer and fall. With this lease they are responsible for out of pocket expenses that their usage requires. This will be the ninth year we have partnered with NEFL to provide this program at our facilities.

Park Terms and Definitions:

Summary:

The design team has been hard at work collecting data and presenting that data to interested parties for input and more data collection. Last week we met with Department Directors, Hamilton County Parks, Hamilton County Tourism, and the Common Council to present details of the first findings from the data collected by Pros Consulting regarding the direction of the schematic design and to solicit feedback on the design of the park. The results so far have been very favorable towards the design of the park with the idea that a new partner or a developer could change the direction of the park or what potentially might be located on the property. There will be a short presentation to the Board regarding the study and what it has revealed.

Background:

The Board approved a contract amendment with Context to engage Pros Consulting to study the proposed program at Finch Creek Park and to provide us with a Pro Forma to be able to make final decisions about the direction of the design of Finch Creek. The results of this plan and feedback from interested parties will guide us in the direction we go and approach the Council for funding and to what direction we will start design development and how the park might be constructed from a phasing standpoint.
