### Assistant Director Report

Ms. Spehler gave the Assistant Director's report. She reported on the sponsorship, which they had a goal of about \$65,000 and have raised about \$37,000 to date. The Federal Hill Commons Grand Opening coming up and the sponsors involved are the Parks Foundation, Indiana American Water, Riverview Health, Recreation Insites and Boomerang Development. She reported she is also working with McGavic on their 5 year sponsorship commitment. Ms. Spehler said the upcoming April events are at the bottom of the agenda. She also reported on the new full-time staff coming on for the Parks Maintenance and the part time seasonal staff. The inspection on the carousel this week, went well.

Mr. Hoffmeister said that the grant for the Southside Park has been official accepted by DNR as of today. He also reported the "Return of the Mac"; the Mac 'n Cheese festival that was at Indianapolis, will be held at Federal Hill Commons on June 3<sup>rd</sup>.

### Park Terms and Definitions:

### Summary:

The additional bollards for traffic control as well as placing and reutilizing some limestone harvested from the old Mill building has been completed. The playground safety surface has been completed. The seat wall that had a few pieces of stone that were manufactured improperly has been completed. The site furnishings have been ordered for the patio area and the lawn. Concrete sealer has been completed. We are working on final punch list items for the site. We will do a soft opening of the park on Monday, March 27<sup>th</sup>. The Park team continues to work on the programming for our inaugural event season at Federal Hill. The grand opening is April 29<sup>th</sup>.

### Background:

Federal Hill Commons is the park the city determined met the best use for a 6.4 acre tract of land between 32 and Logan Street and Nixon and St. Rd. 19. The land, mostly floodplain, has been home to Dave Mason Car Repair and open space. The City will also acquire the existing Ameriana Bank in 2016 as a part of this project. Through the vision of the city as well as several focus groups, the program has been determined to include an amphitheater, event space, restrooms and storage, a farmer's market plaza, interactive water feature, shelters, trails, playground, and parking. It will also eventually be connected by a pedestrian bridge across the river from the Hamilton County Judicial Center. The project is slated to begin construction in summer and have the initial phase open 2016.

### Park Terms and Definitions:

#### Summary:

All permits have been acquired and the project is well underway. The plumbing for the restroom was installed at the end of last week. Framing and drywall should commence anytime. Myers Construction Management pitched to us the idea of completing the "patio" which is the old teller lane as a sponsorship and we worked out the arrangements for a 5 year deal. In addition to what we agreed to pay for with the restroom remodel and the wall/glass conversion, Myers will be constructing the outside patio area complete with fencing to enclose the patio, concrete surface, and concrete stairs leading down the hill to the park walkway. They are also painting the inside of the building and also building the kitchenette. All of the new work is being performed at no cost to us in exchange for naming rights to the patio and use of the facility for some of our events to entertain. In addition the sponsorship agreement includes a \$10,000 donation to us for our events for each of the next four years beginning in 2018. The value of the construction they are donating is estimated to be \$25k.

### Background:

Since the City has acquired the bank building at Federal Hill Commons the staff has been making repairs, improvements and changes to the building to better serve our needs and future plans. In order to accommodate rentals, corporate events, VIP space, Beer Gardens, and Band dressing rooms and Green Room events, a few additions will need to be made. Staff has requested quotes from Myers Construction to add additional restrooms (currently there is one stall), and change the teller drive through to a glass garage door opening the building up to the drive thru and making that space more attractive as a patio and more of an open air building as weather and events permit.
