ABANDONED VEHICLES

- ◆ A vehicle cannot be left on public property for more than 24 hours and cannot be left on private property for more than 48 hours without consent of the property owner.
- ◆ A vehicle is considered abandoned if it is [inoperative](#).



CAMPERS AND RECREATIONAL VEHICLES

- ◆ All campers and recreational vehicles must be stored in an enclosed building or behind the [front facade](#) of the residence.
- ◆ Recreational vehicles and campers may be parked anywhere on private property for loading or unloading purposes for no longer than a 48 hour period.
- ◆ Visitation is permitted for a maximum of ten (10) consecutive days and a total of fourteen (14) days annually.



BOAT TRAILERS, TRAVEL TRAILERS, AND WORK TRAILERS

- ◆ All trailers must be stored in an enclosed building or behind the [front facade](#) of the building.
- ◆ A trailer may be parked anywhere on private property for loading or unloading purposes for no longer than a 48 hour period.
- ◆ A parked or stored trailer may not be occupied or used for living, sleeping, or housekeeping purposes.



JUNK VEHICLES AND VEHICLES WITH EXPIRED PLATES

- ◆ A junk vehicle is any vehicle that is [inoperative](#), partially dismantled, wrecked, totaled, or without valid registration or current license plates.
- ◆ Junk vehicles or vehicles without current license plates cannot be stored on a property for more than seven (7) days other than in a completely enclosed building.



ALL VEHICLES

- ◆ No more than two (2) recreational vehicles shall be parked or stored at any one time; however, one (1) additional recreational vehicle may be permitted for visitation for a maximum of ten (10) consecutive days and not to exceed fourteen (14) days in any one year.
- ◆ The wheels of a vehicle cannot be removed except for repairs, and no vehicle can be permanently fixed to the ground in a manner that would prevent ready removal of the vehicle.
- ◆ A parked or stored vehicle may not be occupied or used for living, sleeping, or housekeeping purposes.
- ◆ No vehicle may be parked in a manner that constitutes a hazard or obstruction to the movement of pedestrian or vehicle traffic on a public right-of-way.
- ◆ Vehicles may be parked or stored anywhere on a property zoned SR (Low Density Single-Family Residential) provided that they do not violate any other ordinance and that no storage occurs within the required front yard setback.
